- 1. When you pray "Your will be done" whose will are you praying against? In other words, if God's will is done, what happens to your will?
- 2. With the discussion of the first question in mind, talk about how it is that "true prayer prays against itself." Does this affect the way you think about prayer?
- 3. Watch the video again. What is God's will for you? Had you thought about God's will in this way before?
- 4. When you have doubt about God's will for you, are you at peace? With that in mind, talk about how praying these words Jesus gave us makes you feel.
- 5. Can you see how Jesus is being a little sneaky here by giving you these words to pray, and thus making you pray against yourself?
